Jocelyn Fay has served the Seventh-day Adventist Church at every level of its organization—local church, conference, union, division and General Conference.

As a laywoman, she has worked in cradle roll, primary, and adult Sabbath Schools. Fay has chaired a large church's nominating committee, and she has been a local elder and church clerk.

In her professional life, she has served the church with distinction. Fay's first job out of college was in the Lake Union Conference office, where she worked on the Herald. After three years, she was called to the Far Eastern Division, where as managing editor of the Far Eastern Division Outlook, she

observed and wrote about the church throughout Asia.

But it was at the **Adventist Review** that Fay's name and face became well known throughout the North American Division. During her 13 years on the magazine's staff, she held several titles, including managing editor. It was Fay who kept the weekly on schedule, serving as liaison between the editorial staff at the General Conference and the production staff at the Review and Herald Publishing Association, 70 miles away.
